Maintenance of Testamur in Echocardiography (MOTE) FAQ's

What is NBE's Maintenance of Testamur in Echocardiography (MOTE)?

- MOTE is an annual initiative through which Testamurs will participate to maintain their Testamur status, superseding National Board of Echocardiography's (NBE) former static ten-year recertification examination (ReASCE, RePTE, and ReBasic PTE) process. It is a user-friendly, lifelong learning platform that can be accessed on mobile devices (app download required) or using Google Chrome web browsers.
- Testamurs will utilize their preferred platform to respond to 48 questions annually and sustain a ≥ 0.20 MDT value to uphold their status.

What led to this change?

- Educational research has shown longitudinal assessment is the best way to maintain in-depth knowledge and proficiency. This will enable NBE to more frequently offer questions emphasizing practical knowledge in echocardiography, reflecting a standard echocardiography practice.
- With physicians' schedules becoming increasingly demanding, MOTE supports and enables personalized knowledge acquisition, assessment, and demonstration of proficiencies with minimal time commitment.

Are there eligibility requirements for MOTE?

- Eligible physicians will have a valid Testamur status or enroll during the amnesty period.
- Testamurs must possess an active, unrestricted license to practice medicine OR be enrolled and in good standing in an United States ACGME Accredited Program or equivalent.
- Anyone who earned NBE Testamur status at any time is eligible to enroll and participate in MOTE.
- Those who passed an NBE exam AND achieved board certification status (i.e. NBE Diplomate) should instead enroll in the Maintenance of Certification in Echocardiography (MOCE).

When am I required to enroll and participate in MOTE?

Beginning in July 2024, new Testamurs must enroll and participate in the MOTE program the following calendar year after passing their exam. In the future, they must also enroll and participate in MOTE for the subsequent calendar year and every year thereafter. For example, those who pass the NBE's Advanced PTEeXAM, Basic PTEeXAM, or ASCeXAM in July 2024 must enroll and participate in MOTE in 2025.

Can I enroll in MOTE if my Testamur status has expired?

- Yes. There is an amnesty period until December 31, 2027, for Testamurs with expired statuses (i.e., passed their last NBE exam ten or more years ago). Amnesty will allow expired NBE Testamurs to reinstate their status upon enrolling, paying, and fulfilling the MOTE requirements. If expired NBE Testamurs do not enroll and complete MOTE requirements during the amnesty period, they must retake the initial examination to regain NBE Testamurs status.
- Beginning in 2025, enrollment will require an \$85 annual fee.

Am I required to enroll in MOTE if my Testamur status has not expired?

- No, it is not required.
- Participation is optional but highly encouraged and free of charge until your expiration date. Then, you will be required to enroll, pay the \$85 annual fee, and complete the MOTE requirements to maintain your status.

How do I get started?

MOTE is scheduled to launch in July 2024, and you will be notified via the email address on file with NBE. Please ensure that your contact information is up-to-date and accurate. Once available, you will complete enrollment from your NBE user dashboard. There will be no fee for participants in 2024. Once your enrollment has been submitted, you will receive a welcome email with instructions on logging in to begin answering questions in the MOCE platform

What is the cost of MOTE?

MOTE is \$85 per year, due each January beginning in 2025.

How many questions will there be?

- 12 multiple choice questions will be released each quarter.
- 48 total questions are required to be answered annually by December 31.
- A maximum of 12 questions can be answered per day per specialty.

How long will I have to answer each question?

There is a three (3) minute, or 180 second, time limit to answer each question.

How many answer choices does each question have?

There will be three (3) answer choices per question.

Can I answer all 48 questions in the last quarter of the year?

- MOTE was designed to be answered over time rather than all at once to promote continuous learning and knowledge retention. However, if you get behind and need to answer all 48 questions in the final quarter of a given year, you can only answer a maximum of 12 questions per day.
- You must answer 48 questions annually by 11:59 p.m. EST on Dec. 31 and maintain a performance standard defined by a Measurement Decision Theory (MDT) value of ≥ 0.20 .
- Measurement Decision Theory (MDT) estimates the probability that candidates are keeping their knowledge up-to-date based on their pattern of responses to questions.

What if I do not answer all 48 questions in a year or do not maintain my MDT value ≥ 0.20 ?

- Any unanswered questions at the end of the year will be marked incorrect and negatively impact your MDT value.
- Testamurs who do not complete the annual MOTE requirements by December 31 will be designated Conditional status for that year.
- The 2nd year a Testamur does not complete the annual MOTE requirements by December 31, they will be designated Inactive status.

Why would my NBE Testamur status be designated as "Inactive"?

Two consecutive years of not completing the MOTE requirements will result in an Inactive status.

Once Inactive, how do I regain Active MOTE status?

Testamurs designated Inactive MUST pass the initial exam(s) again to earn "Maintenance of Testamur in Echocardiography" status.
